

## AAPA Membership

AAPA is the industry body representing all parts of the Australian bituminous flexible pavement sector. AAPA membership is open to professional practitioners and organisations who support the sector and are passionate and committed to the advancement of the use and reuse of bituminous pavement products

AAPA membership is broad. Examples of the 200 AAPA members encompass (but not limited to) bitumen suppliers, asphalt producers, bituminous spray seal operators, road construction companies, consulting firms, tollway operators, stewardship maintenance contractors, academic and research bodies, equipment suppliers, traffic control companies and government.

## AAPA Member Categories

A company or firm engaged within Australia in the business covered by one of the following sub-categories may be elected a **Producer Member**:

### Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) Manufacturer

- a) HMA Manufacturer – Category A is one engaged in the manufacture of the product hot-mix asphalt in three or more States of the Commonwealth and with a total consumption in excess of 50,000 tonnes of bitumen annually.
- b) HMA Manufacturer – Category B is one engaged in the manufacture of the product hot-mix asphalt who does not meet the parameters for Category A membership.

### Bitumen Supplier

- c) Bitumen Supplier is one engaged in the manufacture or importing of the product road-grade bitumen with throughput in excess of five million litres of bitumen annually.
- d) Emulsion and Modified Binder Supplier is one engaged in the manufacture of the products bitumen emulsion, polymer modified binders or similar with throughput in excess of one million litres of bitumen annually.

### Sprayed Surfacing Operator

- e) A Sprayed Surfacing Operator is one engaging in the application of bituminous surfacing on roads with a throughput in excess of 3 million litres of bitumen annually.

Other individual or organisational members are categorised as:

### Government Member

A Government body or agency engaged within Australia in the design, construction or maintenance of bituminous bound pavements in one of the following sub-categories may be elected a Government Member:

- a) Federal/State Government organisation
- b) Local Government organisation

### Associate Member

An instrumentality company firm educational body or natural person who does not qualify for Producer Membership but is registered within Australia and:

- a) is engaged in the construction of bituminous pavements, or
- b) is a supplier of either materials or equipment to the road construction industry, or
- c) is actively interested in the promotion and advancement of the road construction industry

- may be elected an Associate Member.

### Affiliate Member

A natural person who is actively interested in the field of bituminous bound pavements but who does not qualify for Producer or Associate Membership may be elected an Affiliate Member.

### Tollway Member

An organisation with Australia that operates the running of Australian roads commercially through the recovery of tolls – including shadow tolls, may be considered for Tollway membership.

### Overseas Member

An instrumentality company firm educational body or natural person carrying on business or residing outside Australia and actively engaged in the field of bituminous product related activities may be elected an Overseas Member.

\* Local governments with a population below 10,000 as per the latest ABS survey will receive free AAPA membership.

\*\* Producer member fees are based on volume of binder used annually for the prior financial year. Applicants should contact the AAPA office on (03) 8416 4500 to be advised that latest rate per category.

Membership applications are considered quarterly within a financial year and are subject to approval from the AAPA Board. Applications approved after 30 December in a given year will be subject to 50% of fees due for year 1 only.

### AAPA Member Cancellation Terms

1. A Producer Member shall be entitled to resign from Membership if such Member shall have first given six months notice in writing of intention so to do and during such six months such Member shall continue liable for payment of all subscriptions and all dues and interest thereon as hereinafter provided.
2. All other Members shall be entitled to resign from Membership at any time by giving notice in writing of intention so to do provided that any subscription then due by such Member shall have been paid.

Note: Not paying membership fees within a given financial year does not constitute cancellation of membership and as such fees for that financial year will remain owed.
